

North Carolina Required Immunization & Health History Information

Welcome to the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. North Carolina General Statute §130A 154-155.1 requires that students entering college present a certificate of immunization which documents that the student has received immunizations required by law. 1. Login to your ConnectCarolina Student Center account . Click on the General Item link under your To Do List. Click on the Immunization Health History link and follow the directions for accessing the online form. **This link will only be available once your program matriculates you into your program.
2. Once you finish each page of the online form, click the "Next" button to go to the next page of the form.
3. Once you reach the Immunization History page, enter all immunization dates if known, in the corresponding spaces.
4. On the finish page, click the "Get PDF of Immunization Record" button to print your Immunization and Health History Form.
5. After printing the form, have your local health care provider sign the printed form to verify all immunization dates on the form OR you may attach copies of a verified certificate of immunization (see below for requirements) in lieu of getting a health care provider signature.

A verified certificate of immunization must include the name, address, sex, and date of birth of the student. The certificate must also include the name, number of doses, and the dates of all vaccines given as well as the name and address of the medical provider, clinic or local health department administering the required immunizations. If the immunization certificate is coming from a previous school, we can accept the record if the school stamps the record with their official seal/stamp.

6. Sign the Patient Agreement and complete the TB Screening form that prints with the Immunization and Health History Form.
7. Upload all completed and signed documents as a single file by June 15th for Fall admission or December 15th for Spring admission into the To Do List item on your Student Services page in ConnectCarolina (accepted file formats are .pdf and .tiff) *please note there is a 15mb size limit.
8. If you are missing immunization requirements, an additional To Do list item will be added to your account indicating what requirements have not been met. If you meet all requirements, you will not see any additional to do list items on your account.

Important Notes

- Campus Health will not accept mailed/faxed/emailed records, all records must be uploaded through your ConnectCarolina To Do list item
- All immunization records are required to be submitted in, or translated into, English
- Students from countries with an increased incidence of TB or have spent greater than one month in a country with an increased incidence of TB must provide documentation of TB screening – Please see the following link for more information: <https://campushealth.unc.edu/services/immunizations/international-student-tb-information>
- **YOU WILL BE WITHDRAWN FROM THE UNIVERSITY** 30 days after classes begin if immunization requirements have not been met.
- Include your FULL NAME and UNC PERSONAL ID# (PID#) on all submitted documents
- **Health Science Students:** Your program will require a copy of your immunization record. It is YOUR responsibility to provide your program with this information. You will need to keep a copy of your records to forward to your program; Campus Health Services will not automatically forward this information to your program. North Carolina Vaccine Requirements

Diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis

Three doses are required for individuals entering college or university, one of which must be tetanus/diphtheria/pertussis (Tdap) given in or after 2005. All students must meet this requirement regardless of age.

Polio

Three doses are required for individuals entering college or university. An individual attending school who has attained his or her 18th birthday is not required to receive polio vaccine.

Measles*

Two doses at least 28 days apart are required for individuals entering college or university. The requirement for a second dose does not apply to individuals who entered college or university for the first time before July 1, 1994. A person who has been diagnosed prior to January 1, 1994 by a physician (or designee such as a nurse practitioner or physician's assistant) as having measles (rubeola) or an individual who has been documented by serological testing to have a protective antibody titer against measles is not required to receive measles vaccine. Individuals born before 1957 are not required to receive measles vaccine except in measles outbreak situations.

Mumps*

Two doses are required for individuals entering college or university. A physician's diagnosis is not acceptable for mumps disease(s). Individuals must be immunized or have laboratory confirmation of disease or have been documented by serological testing to have a protective antibody against mumps. Individuals born before 1957 are not required to receive the mumps vaccine. Individuals that entered college or university before July 1, 1994 are not required to receive the vaccine. Individuals that entered college, or university before July 1, 2008 are not required to receive the second dose of mumps vaccine.

Rubella*

One dose is required for individuals entering college or university. A physician's diagnosis is not acceptable for rubella disease(s). Individuals must be immunized or have laboratory confirmation of rubella disease or have been documented by serological testing to have a protective antibody titer against rubella. Any individual who has attained his or her fiftieth birthday is not required to receive rubella vaccine except in outbreak situations. Any individual who entered college or university after his or her thirtieth birthday and before February 1, 1989 is not required to receive rubella vaccine except in outbreak situations.

Hepatitis B

Three doses are required for individuals entering college or university. Hepatitis B titers are not acceptable for this requirement; students will need to show documentation of three vaccine doses. Hepatitis B vaccine is not required if an individual was born before July 1, 1994.

- 2 doses of MMR vaccine will meet this requirement
